Context:

The hybrid workshop, Classification of Tropical Forests, organised by CIRAD (a Euragri member) and its partners, will occur **in Paris on October 23 between 15:00 and 18:00 (CET)**. The 2023 European Regulation tackles global deforestation by prohibiting certain products, including wood, from deforested land or degraded forest by the end of 2020.

The workshop will focus on updating participants on the results of the CIRAD-coordinated project: "Development of a method for classifying tropical forests according to their ecological diversity and degradation - Case study in Brazil". The project aims to refine the characterization of forests by linking their definition to an ecological classification that distinguishes undisturbed or little-disturbed forests from heavily degraded forests. It is opportune to discuss the issue against the background of the possible regulation revision.
